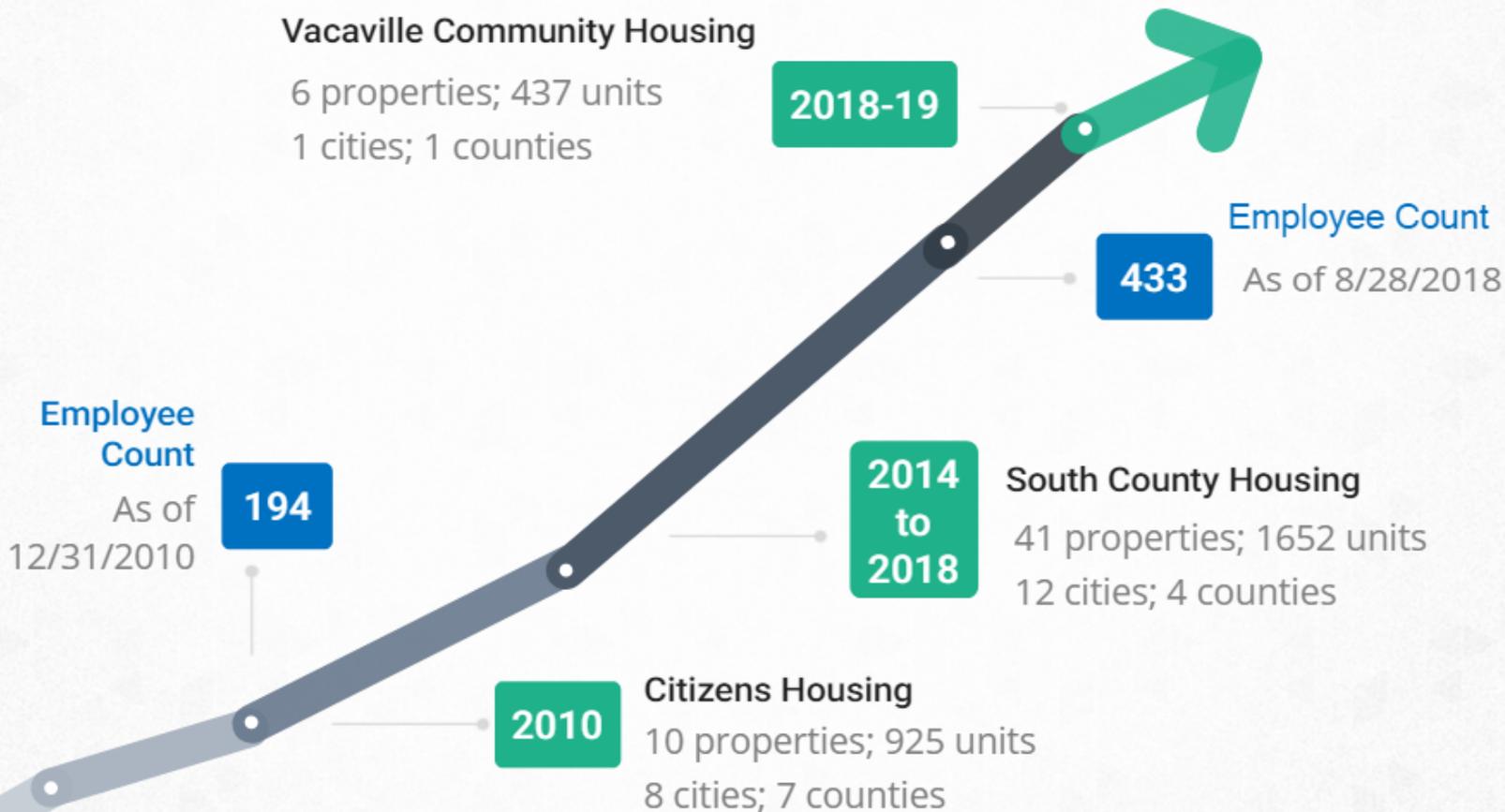

Lessons Learned:

1. Know where you are best at working
2. You cannot do anything at any cost
3. Be clear about your expectations with investor/lenders/regulators

Lessons Learned:

1. # of properties matters more than the # of units
2. Layered financing = delays
3. Manage integration of company cultures
4. It is in your interest to keep the other side in business long enough to complete the transaction
5. Have a clear deadline to exit executives

1 cities; 1 counties

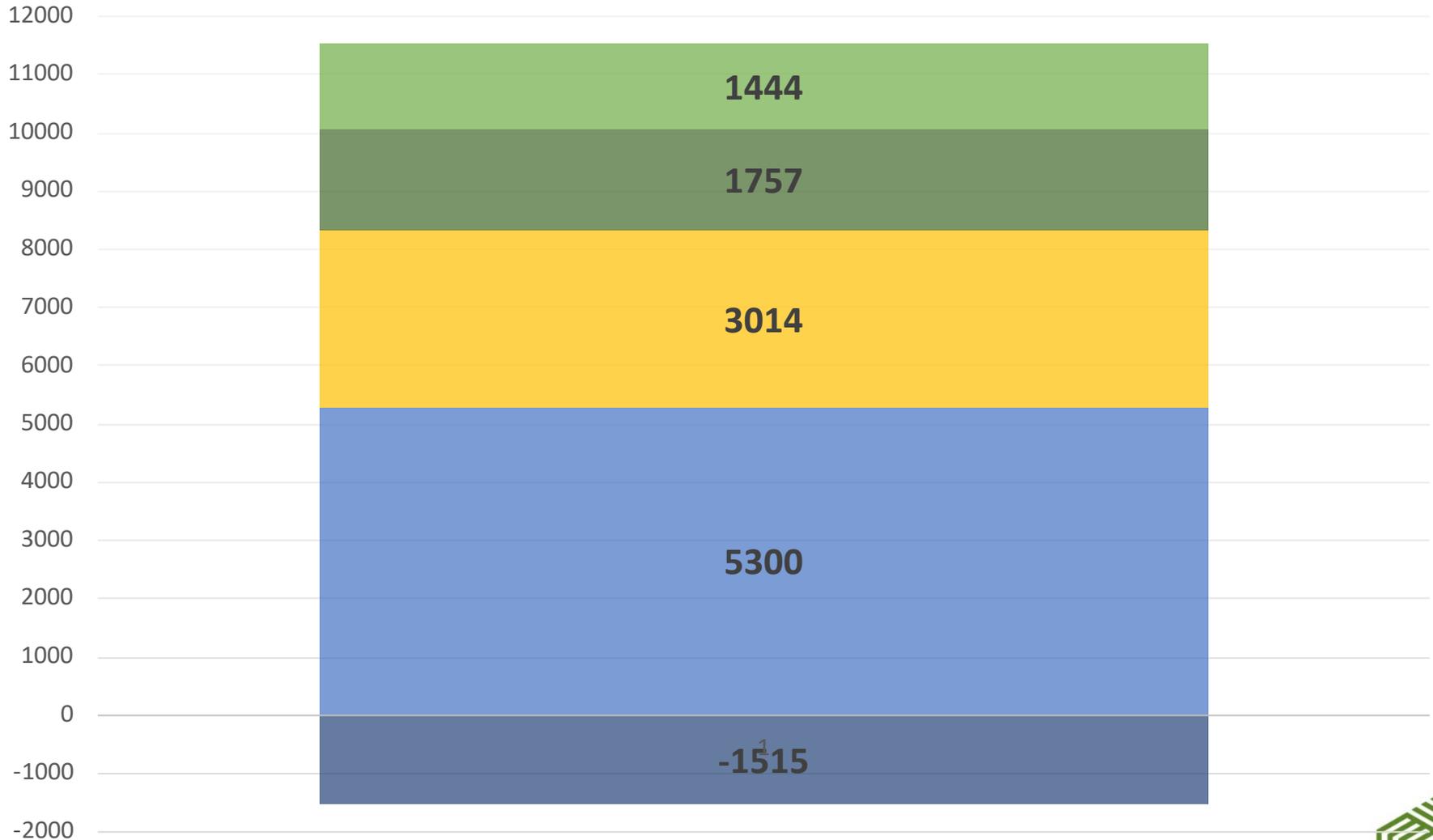
